- 7:45 **“Truly Savage: The Revolution Without Washington”**
By Scott Miskimon, George Washington was never in the Carolinas during the American Revolution, and from 1780-1782 the most savage warfare of the conflict was waged in North and South Carolina, clearly at odds with Washington’s principled, humanitarian approach. Despite the bitterness and devastation of the war years, under the leadership of some extraordinary patriots, the Carolinas became peaceful constitutional republics. The presentation will include rare historical evidence shedding new light on how the Revolution was fought in North and South Carolina and the military experiences of the men who later became some of North Carolina’s most notable lawyers, such as William Richardson Davie and John Stokes. Mr. Miskimon will discuss how their wartime activities during the Revolution shaped their careers as lawyers, the law of North Carolina, and the ratification of the United States Constitution.
